

<u>Title</u>: Shipkeeper

Hours: Part-Time; weekends required; some evenings, holidays, and special events work may be required; may be called-in to assist with major emergencies on scheduled hours off

Compensation: Non-exempt position

Reports to: Curator of Historic Ships

<u>Description</u>: The Shipkeeper will interact effectively with visiting public and staff with a main focus on historic ships conservation, restoration, and repair tasks, reporting directly to the Historic Ships Curator. The Shipkeeper works as a team player within and across departments to help advance the mission and vision of the Independence Seaport Museum.

Qualifications:

- Five years' experience in museum maintenance, artifact handling, ship maintenance, building maintenance, or other similar field.
- An understanding of historic preservation standards, an understanding of curatorial practices, maintenance, and interpretation of artifacts or historic sites necessary.
- A strong background or interest in mechanical and maintenance fields needed.
- Experience to safely and accurately use various tooling, both hand and power-operated.
- Ability to work with a team, or independently, with initiative.
- Ability to effectively manage materials and provide clear, comprehensive reporting.
- Good communications and public relations skills needed.
- Holding active automotive Driver's License and/or Marine credentials is a plus.
- Willingness to undertake other shipboard duties and special projects as assigned.
- Must be able to lift 50 lbs., safely handle ladder and staging work, operate at heights & work in confined spaces.
- Requires knowledge of job safety practices, safe use of tools, and handling of ship maintenance materials.
- Must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19. Fully vaccinated is defined as at least two weeks after your final dose.
 Medical and religious exemptions will apply.

Essential Duties:

- Perform routine duties in service to the visiting public and in maintaining and preserving the historic ships.
- Perform routine maintenance and preservation tasks including regular ship cleaning, snow removal, safety patrols, painting, damage control, machine and electrical maintenance, artifact handling, woodworking & steel work.
- Participate in major grant and capital projects.
- Develop knowledge of the history of the historic ships and deliver information to the public consistent with the museum's mission for the ships.
- Assist with the management of volunteers and contractors.
